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Strong SEGRA program revealed

Program details for October's SEGRA conference are now available online.

The national conference of Sustainable Economic Growth for Regional Australia (SEGRA) will be held in the Great Southern at Albany from 26-28 October.

The first two days of the conference feature a combination of plenary sessions with keynote speakers, and breakout sessions that will bring a closer engagement with specific issues. On the third and final day of the conference, delegates will travel throughout the region on a range of study tours.

Western Australian Chief Scientist Professor Peter Klinken and Winthrop Professor of Biodiversity Stephen Hopper AC are on the list of keynote speakers, along with Enterprise Learning Projects CEO Laura Egan, Deloitte Access Economics associate director Kristian Kolding and Thumper One chairman Anthony Bertini.

Federal Regional Development Minister Senator Fiona Nash and State Regional Development Minister Terry Redman will also address the conference.
