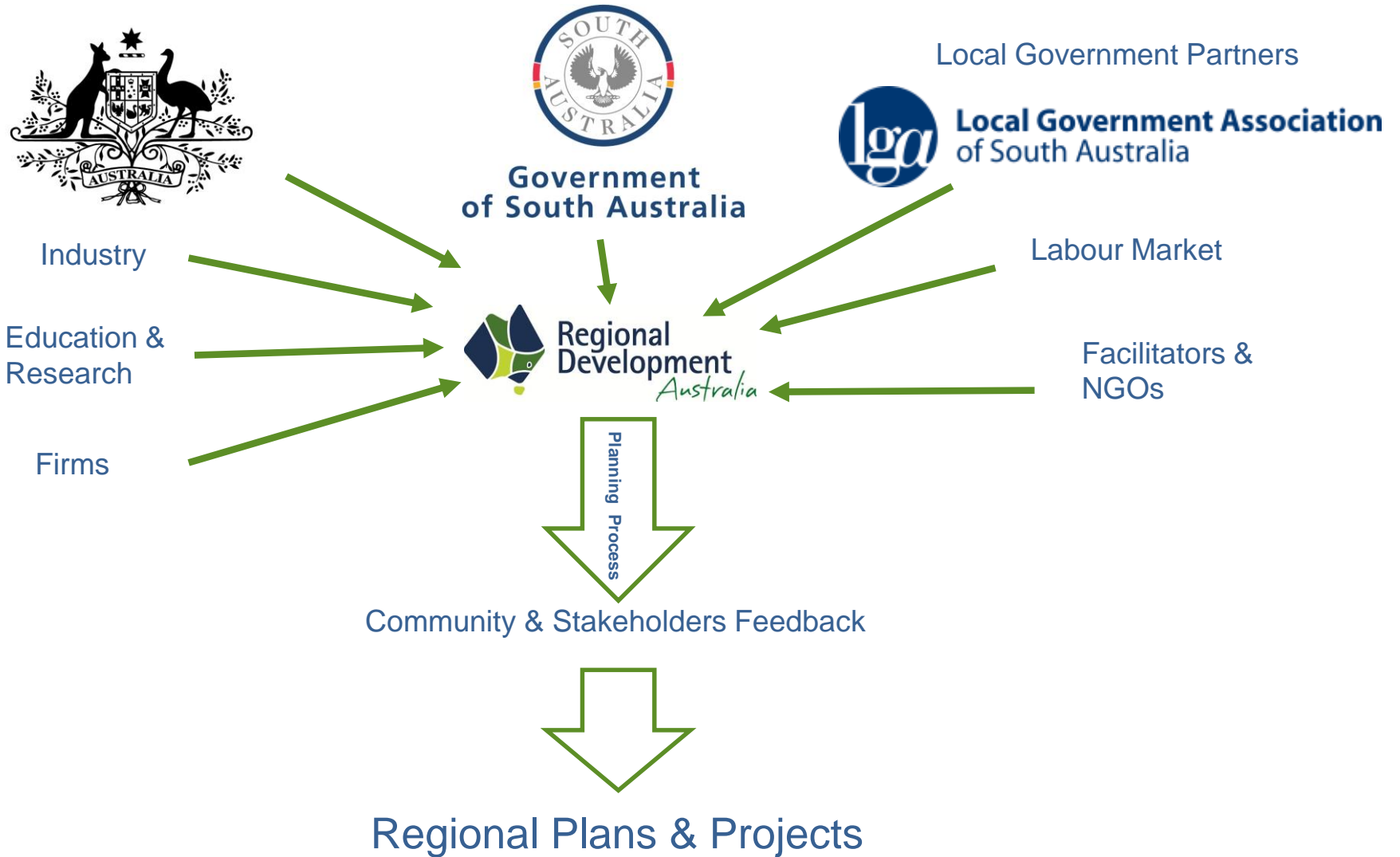

Creating a pipeline of strategic investment projects prioritised across South Australia- 2015 program with State Government.

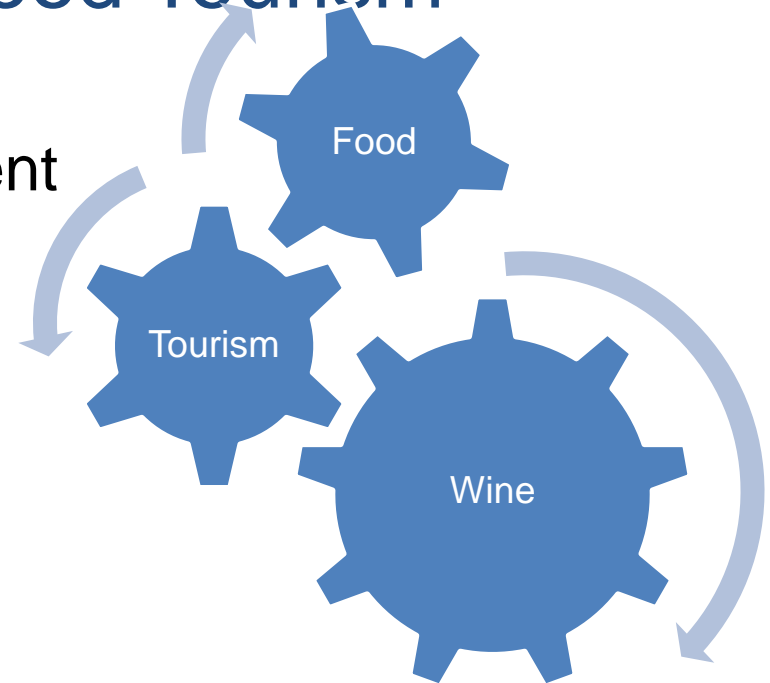
- 17 projects supported- 8 projects feasibility showed investment at this date was not feasible;

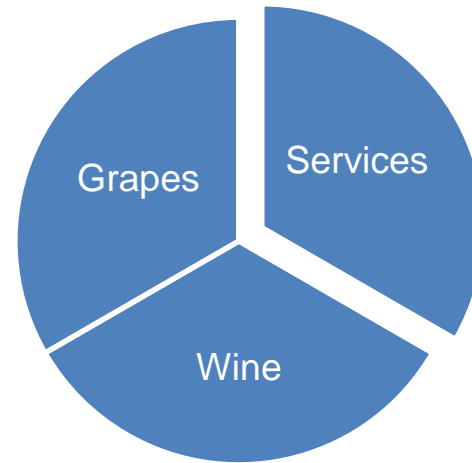

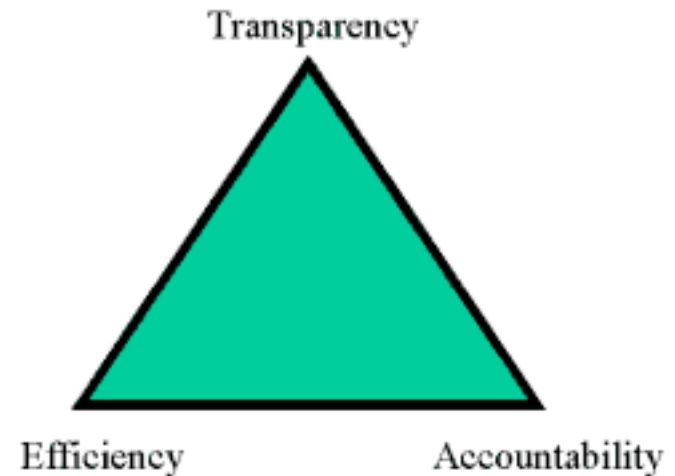
